

<p>Granite Falls School District No. 332 Proposition No. 1</p> <p>Bonds to Improve, Renovate and Construct School Facilities</p> <p>The Board of Directors of Granite Falls School District No. 332 adopted Resolution No. 16/17-03 concerning a proposition to enhance security, safety and educational opportunities. This proposition would authorize the District to: make District-wide security and safety improvements; renovate Granite Falls Middle School to provide flexible, integrated Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM) classrooms; construct a covered grandstand to complete the stadium at Granite Falls High School; issue no more than \$13,725,367 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 16/17-03. <p>Stanwood-Camano School District No. 401 Proposition No. 1</p> <p>Bonds to Construct, Renovate and Improve School Facilities - \$147,500,000</p> <p>The Board of Directors of Stanwood-Camano School District No. 401 adopted Resolution No. 2016/2017-001 concerning bonds to replace educational facilities and improve safety and infrastructure. This proposition would authorize the District to construct a new high school replacing Stanwood High School; construct a new building for Lincoln Hill High and Saratoga Schools; relocate technology and school maintenance facilities, and undertake other capital improvements; issue \$147,500,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum term of 21 years, and levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2016/2017-001. <p>Lake Stevens Library Capital Facility Area Proposition No. 1</p> <p>The Snohomish County Council adopted Motion No. 16-487 concerning a proposition establishing the Lake Stevens Library Capital Facility Area. This proposition would establish the Lake Stevens Library Capital Facility Area, with boundaries that are coextensive with those of the Lake Stevens School District, with all the powers provided in chapter 27.15 RCW, including the power to construct, acquire, maintain and remodel library facilities. <p>Lake Stevens Library Capital Facility Area Proposition No. 2</p> <p>The Snohomish County Council adopted Motion No. 16-487 concerning a proposition to finance a library facility. This proposition would authorize the Lake Stevens Library Capital Facility Area to acquire, construct, furnish and equip a new library in Lake Stevens; to incur indebtedness to finance such improvements through the issuance of up to seventeen million dollars (\$17,000,000) in general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and to levy annual excess property taxes to repay such bonds.
