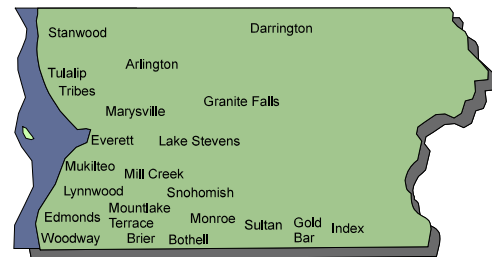

#### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 p.m. by Co-chair Hillary Moralez.

#### 2. Roll Call

Roll call was taken, with attendees as listed above.

#### 4. Action Items

##### a. Approval of minutes (1-15-22)

The minutes of 1-15-22 were unanimously approved.

##### b. Confirm CAB Rep to March 22<sup>nd</sup> and April 26<sup>th</sup> Steering Committee meetings

Kate Nesse confirmed she will attend the March 22 meeting, and Hilary Moralez volunteered to attend the April 25 meeting.

#### 5. Discussion Items

##### a. SCT Position Update

Snohomish County Planning and Development Services Director, Mike McCrary, gave an update on the SCT Manager position. The first round of candidates have been evaluated for interviews which will take place later this week.

##### b. Transportation Presentation

Brock Howell Director of the Snohomish County Transportation Coalition (Snotrac)

gave the CAB a presentation on services the county offers for residents and projects Snotrac is focusing on.

Snotrac advocates for connecting people and communities in the County and beyond with safe, equitable, and accessible transportation. Their priority populations include low income, people with disabilities, older adults, and youth. They also prioritize veterans, Medicaid-funded transportation, Tribes, rural communities, people of color, immigrants, refugees, and those who speak multiple languages.

Fixed route services are found throughout the County. The integration between Everett Transit and Community Transit is key to the County. In 2016 Sound Transit 3 (ST3) was adopted with the ultimate vision to have a 252-mile transit network connecting from Tacoma to Everett. This includes Link light rail, Sounder commuter rail, and Stride bus rapid transit.

There are three Paratransit providers in the County, Community Transit, Everett Para Transit, and Homage Senior Services. These different services cover separate areas of the County and have separate eligibility requirements.

Move Ahead WA is a historic transit package that includes earmarked funds for Snohomish County Transit funding. It also includes highway projects, traffic cameras, ferries, rail, electrification, and fish barrier removal.

Planning processes for transportation include VISION 2050, Regional Transportation Plan, Regional Priority List, 6-Year TIPs, Comprehensive Plans, and the Snohomish County Committee for Improved Transportation (SCCIT) Priority List.

Snotrac has four Sub-County Transportation Committee that meet bi-monthly and is hosting a Universal Design Forum April 19-20.
