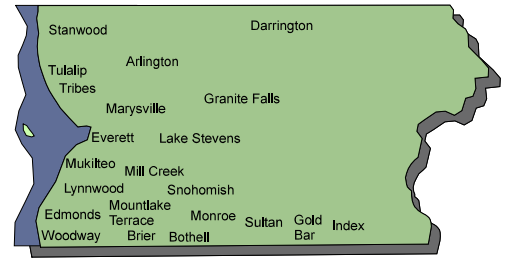

7 **6. Discussion/Update Items**

8 **a. WA Geological Survey's Aggregate Resource Mapping**

9 Tricia Sears and Amy Rudko described a new project to map aggregate resources  
10 around the state. Snohomish County is the second county they reached out to start this  
11 work though the county will be doing it later, next year.  
12

13 The focus of this state-wide work is on construction aggregate, sand, gravel and crushed  
14 stone resources. This kind of aggregate is the "building block" of our community so it is  
15 important to know where it is. State law requires this mapping in order to preserve these  
16 resources for future needs and comprehensive plans must take these resources into  
17 account. They want to complete this mapping for every county in the state.  
18

19 The mapping finds that some resources are not suitable for use.  
20

21 The questions that members asked included whether Everett and Monroe need to do  
22 aggregate mapping, and how the maps that show estimated resources (including in  
23 already developed neighborhoods) would be used. In other words, would this data be  
24 used to set policy?

28 Ms. Sears ended with describing the landslide hazard mapping work in Snohomish  
29 County; the results are due on July 28<sup>th</sup>.

31 **b. Housing Characteristics and Needs Report Update**

32 Amber Piona described the work that the PAC Working Group is doing currently. She  
33 expects to have a draft by September.  
34

35 Members asked if the study has been revised to address recent legislation and if  
36 Commerce targets for housing units will be adopted? How will Commerce's targets sent  
37 to the county be distributed to the cities and will there be changes to CPPs as a result  
38 the distributed targets. How will coordination occur between cities and the county to  
39 make sure the targets will be met in the county overall.

41 **c. PSRC Regional Staff Committee Update**

42 Maggie Moore described the activities of the PSRC boards and committees. They are  
43 holding a workshop on comprehensive plan updates and registration still open. The  
44 Regional Transportation Plan was adopted at the General Assembly in May. A housing  
45 and innovation tools survey will be sent in next month. Members suggesting trying to  
46 coordinate that survey with the county's housing survey, which asks for similar things.  
47

48 **c. PAC Member Go-Round**

49 PAC members asked if review of Steering Committee agendas could be a standing item  
50 on the PAC agenda (including reviewing the Executive Committee meeting).

52 Members also reported on projects in their community.
