Reardon declares Public Safety Telecommunications Week

In a ceremony held today, Snohomish County Executive Aaron Reardon signed a proclamation declaring April 11-17 Public Safety Telecommunications Week.

The recognition is in honor of the men and women of the County's two 9-1-1 centers, SNOCOM and SNOFAC, which provide emergency communications between residents in need and emergency responders twenty-four hours a day.

"When an emergency occurs, the quick response of police, firefighters and paramedics are critical to our health and safety," said Reardon.

"We rely on the knowledge, compassion and professionalism dispatchers to make critical decisions, and quickly dispatch aid. Thank you for your service."

Each year, SNOCOM and SNOFAC responds to more than 900,000 calls requesting emergency services.
