**Project Name:** Jordan Creek Bridge 214 Replacement

**Description of Proposal:** Snohomish County Public Works proposes to replace Jordan Creek Bridge #214, which crosses Jordan Creek on Jordan Road. The existing bridge is a two-lane timber trestle bridge, 21-foot wide and approximately 107-feet in length. It is supported by creosote-treated timber piles and has a timber deck. The bridge is functionally obsolete and structurally deficient. It is currently load limited and reduced to operate with one 16-foot lane. The new single span girder bridge will be 120-feet long and will have two 11-foot wide travel lanes and 6-foot shoulders. Vehicular traffic will be detoured around the site during construction.

A new stormwater conveyance system and infiltration pond is proposed to meet the stormwater requirements of flow control and water quality. New right-of-way acquisitions are required for the proposed roadway and stormwater facility improvements, and to accommodate onsite compensatory mitigation for unavoidable impacts to critical area buffers.

**Location of Proposal:** The proposed bridge replacement project is located on Jordan Road between 143rd Ave NE and 155th Ave NE, southeast of the City of Arlington, in Section 2, Township 31 North, Range 6 East, W.M.

**Threshold Determination:** Snohomish County Public Works has determined that this proposal will not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c). This decision was made after review of a completed Environmental Checklist and Design Report. Snohomish County Public Works has determined the requirements for environmental analysis, protection, and mitigation measures have been adequately addressed in the County's development regulations and comprehensive plan adopted under Chapter 36.70A RCW, and in other applicable local, state, or federal laws and rules, as provided by RCW 43.21C.240 and WAC 197-11-158. Our agency will not require any additional mitigation measures under Chapter 30.61 SCC.

This DNS is issued under WAC 197-11-340(2). It will be published on October 2, 2022, and the comment

period will end 5:00 PM PST on October 17, 2022. Send any comments to the Agency Contact.

**SHORELINE PERMIT:** This project will require a shoreline substantial development permit and/or shoreline conditional use permit pursuant to Chapter 30.44 SCC. The permit application will be submitted to the Department of Planning & Development Services (PDS) at a future time. A notice of application will be issued by PDS with further instructions and a public comment period of 30-days will be offered on the shoreline permit application.

**APPEALS:** There is no opportunity for appeal at this time. Pursuant to SCC 30.61.300 (10), SEPA appeals related to a shoreline substantial development permit shall be submitted to the state shorelines hearings board together with appeal of the underlying shoreline permit.
