

Community Partnership Mini-Grant

Application Form – Due by 5:00 PM, FRIDAY, MARCH 17, 2023

Snohomish County is soliciting applications from school districts and community-based organizations to support implementation of programs and interventions targeting youth substance use and supporting healthy youth development. This opportunity is made possible with funding because of Initiative 502 (I-502) which created the Dedicated Cannabis Account (DCA).

Funding Specifics

- Funding is available up to \$15,000 per project through June 30, 2023.
 - This funding is limited to programs that can be implemented prior to June 30, 2023.
- Eligible applicants include community-based organizations in Snohomish County such as nonprofits, behavioral health agencies, family resource centers, faith-based organizations, and schools and school districts. Eligible applicants must be able to meet insurance requirements and contract with Snohomish County.
- Proposals must align with the current DCA standards, including:
 - Impact youth substance use via prevention, intervention, treatment, recovery support, or mental health promotion strategies;
 - Focus on middle and high school-aged students or families and prenatal and parenting programs; and
 - Align with evidence-based or best practices.
- Examples of DCA-allowed programs, practices, and strategies include, but are not limited to:
 - Implementation of an evidence-based prevention strategy, curriculum, or social emotional learning strategy at a school, youth organization, or other community location.
 - The County does not endorse a specific curriculum, but approved examples include: Botvin LifeSkills, Second Step, PAX Good Behavior Game, Guiding Good Choices, MindUP, COPE, Youth Mental Health First Aid, and Contingency Management for Youth Addiction.
 - Purchase supplies or training or fund short-term services to support ongoing or new programming for prevention, intervention, treatment, recovery support, or mental health promotion strategies.
 - Support a local public awareness campaign to reduce youth substance use or enhance positive social norms.
 - Support youth outreach programs or family support programs, including prenatal and parenting programs.
- Proposals may be used to support or enhance current programs or for new/emerging programs.
- Creativity is highly encouraged!

Application Criteria

- Applications must be completed in this document. Include your agency name in the header of every page as formatted. Additional documents (budget sheet, documentation of evidence-base or effectiveness) may be attached separately.
- Applications are due via email to Michael.O'Brien@snoco.org no later than **Friday, March 17, 2023, at 5pm**. Applications may be attached in PDF or Word format. Late applications will not be accepted.
- Applications will be reviewed after the due date and applicants will be notified of the funding decision via email no later than Friday March 24, 2023.
