Job Foundation Application

- ❖ Job Foundation engages, connects, and launches efforts earlier for students in their second to last year of Transition (ages 19 to 20 years old) who are eligible with Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA). This occurs through discovery and the completion of a Job Foundation Report which includes actionable next steps for paid employment.
 - Students who participate in Job Foundation will segue into School to Work (S2W) in their final year of Transition, there is no need to fill out a S2W application.
