- Adding 'urban open space/preserve acres' as a new level of service (LOS) metric
- Removing 'waterfront miles' from the LOS metrics
- Allowing all park properties, including special use and open space/preserve properties to qualify as 'necessary to support development,' and therefore allow any type of park classification to feature the facilities that are required to meet demand and LOS minimum standards
