DEVIATION REQUEST

(For Projects Vested On or After January 22, 2016)

A. Instructions:

1. This form shall be used to request a deviation from an EDDS standard that does not apply to stormwater management pursuant to the Drainage Code. Requests to deviate from stormwater management standards shall be processed as County Code modifications or waivers in accordance with SCC 30.63A.170.
2. Submit a separate deviation request for each standard that is proposed for deviation, except where the standards are related and should be evaluated as a single proposal. In such cases, a single deviation request may be submitted but complete documentation and justification are required for each standard to be considered.
3. Provide sufficient information to evaluate the request, including applicable EDDS section(s), standard drawing numbers, engineering calculations or other data. Engineering calculations or analysis shall be prepared by an engineer licensed in the State of Washington.
4. An EDDS deviation request shall not be used to modify or waive a requirement of County Code, such as SCC Chapters 30.24 (Roads and Access) or 30.66B (Concurrency and Road Impact Mitigation).

Please bring the complete application, all supporting documentation and the applicable fee of **\$1,390.50 per request** (includes a 3% technology surcharge per SCC 30.86.030).
