

PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

To review changes to the plan presented at the fourth public meeting and allow the public to provide comments and ask questions.

DISCUSSION

Tom Teigen explained the current progress of the park project. Steve Dickson reviewed the current progress on the road project. Bruce Dees reviewed the changes to the previous plan, notably the relocation of the dog park to the west side of the site, the relocation and reorientation of the northern parking lot and changes to the northern entry road, and the elimination of the north pedestrian bridge. Bruce then asked for feedback from the public.

PUBLIC COMMENT

In general, there were numerous comments and concerns pertaining to traffic, noise, and the desire for fewer fields as well as praise of the new facility and the benefits that it will have to the youth of the area. Because these comments have already been documented in previous meeting minutes, the following reflect only the new comments made:

- Three fields should be lined for boy's lacrosse because of the sport's popularity.
- More picnic shelters should be located in the community space north of 240th St.
- Consider implementing fewer speed bumps than the three proposed.
 - Consider constructing the roundabout and raised intersection with the project, but add the speed bumps later as needed.
- There was a question to clarify the Phase I improvement from Phase II. Tom Teigen explained that in general, the Community Activity Center and the Mountain Bike Facility labeled on the plan will be constructed in Phase II or later. Other elements will be constructed in Phase I.
- There was a question to clarify when the road would open in relation to the opening of the park. Tom Teigen explained that the road construction would occur prior to the park opening.
