I understand you contacted George Godley regarding further clarification as to the meaning of transit sponsor. George is out of the office so I am responding to your question. The term transit sponsor was nothing formal, rather it was used to imply that one of the three transit agencies (Sound Transit, Metro or Community Transit) needs to review and affirm any plans that are proposed for bringing transit service on site. This can be a "qualified" affirmation since the agency may not have plans in the short term future but may see feasibility in the long term as the economic conditions improve and makes service feasible. The bottom line is that one of the three agencies needs to acknowledge in writing that one day it may service the property and the proposed site plan showing on-site transit service (i.e. transit center) and level of service will work. I hope this answers your question.
