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The Snohomish County Family and Interagency Coordinating Council is a local group of parents of young children age birth to six, community agencies, school districts, early intervention and early learning service providers, and advocates who share a common interest in special needs children in Snohomish County. There are two co-chairs who serve on this Council and a steering committee that helps with planning the meetings.

Activities include but are not limited to:

- Promote active parent participation in early intervention system.
- Advise and assist the Snohomish County Early Intervention Program, the County Lead Agency, and its activities with regards to coordination of early intervention services in the Snohomish County area
- Promote interagency coordination and agreements
- Active recruitment to include representatives of local stakeholders such as;
 - Child care agencies
 - DSHS Community Services Offices
 - DSHS Division of Children and Family Services responsible for foster care placement
 - Early Head Start programs
 - Early learning child care agencies
 - Educational Service Districts
 - Head Start Programs
 - Local agencies and providers that provide early intervention services
 - Local agencies and providers who provide services to infants and toddlers without disabilities and their families
 - Medical providers/hospitals/private health care
 - Military, if appropriate
 - School Districts
 - School District McKinney-Vento Coordinators
 - Tribal governments/programs
 - Washington State Migrant Council
 - Washington Work First
