Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) and Notice of Land Disturbing Activity

Pursuant to the provisions of Snohomish County Code (SCC) Chapters 30.70.050(2) and 30.61.110

WHAT IS PROPOSED?

Snohomish County Public Works is proposing to:

- **Realign the intersection of Springhetti Road and Broadway Ave. to eliminate the skewed angle and improve the sight distance**
- **Widen shoulders and construct retaining walls on Springhetti Rd.**
- **Add guardrail on the west side of Springhetti Rd.**
- **Preliminary quantities for cut and fill volumes are 5,400 cubic yards of cut and 900 cubic yards of fill**
- **Construction is planned in 2013**

To comment on this project:

- Submit written comments to Public Works, c/o Mary Auld, at the address below or via email. All comments received prior to a decision will be reviewed. Comments must be received by **January 9, 2012**.

Note: The Dept. of Public Works only publishes decisions as required by Snohomish County Code. Persons will receive notice of all decisions that they have submitted written comments on, regardless of whether or not they are published. You may become a party of record for a project by submitting original written comments and requesting to be a party of record. Only parties of record may subsequently file appeals.

To appeal a SEPA decision:

Submit a written appeal and the \$500 filing fee to Public Works prior to 5 p.m. **January 9, 2012**. Refer to SCC 30.71.050(5) for details on what must be included in a written appeal. A SEPA appeal also requires that an affidavit or declaration be filed with the Snohomish County Hearing Examiner within seven days of filing the appeal pursuant to SCC 30.61.305(1).

Permits/Approvals Required:

- Land Disturbing Activity permit is required
- Other applicable federal, state and local permits

SEPA Decision:

Public Works has determined that this project does not have a probable, significant adverse impact on the environment and has issued a Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS). An environmental impact statement (EIS) under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c) is not required. This decision was made after review of a completed environmental checklist and other information on file with this agency.

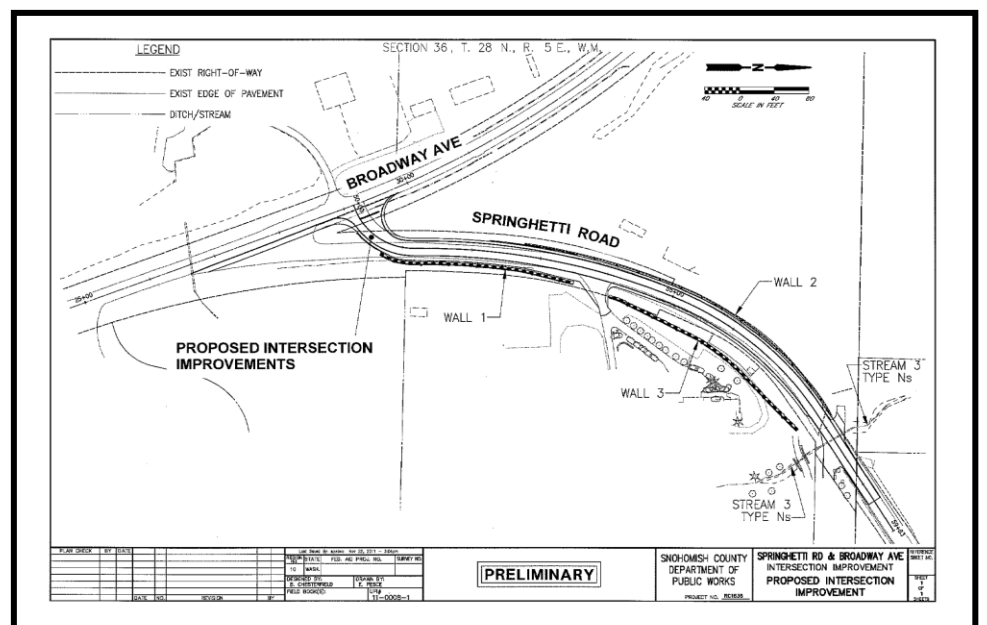
