Consideration

Motion 19-166 would appoint James Kamp to the Snohomish County Planning Commission in one of the Council District 5 positions. The appointment is for a first full term and would expire on July 1, 2023.

Background

The Snohomish County Planning Commission is an advisory body to the County Council and County Executive. The commission holds public hearings and provides recommendations on proposed changes to the county's comprehensive plan and development regulations. The commission is made up of eleven members, two from each council district and one at-large member nominated by the executive, which serve four-year terms and may not serve more than two complete consecutive terms.

Snohomish County Code ([2.03.060](#) and [2.08.080](#)) provides that the council appoints planning commission members, requires that members not be county employees, requires members to have sufficient time to attend all scheduled meetings, and requires that members not serve on more than two boards or commissions at the same time (ad hoc or advisory committees do not count against the limit).

County code also provides that nominees should possess attributes including a background in one or more of the following: architecture, law, farming, recreation, finance, real estate, environment, construction, fisheries, engineering, appraisal, land use planning, education, related backgrounds, or job knowledge or interests that will add balance to the commission. Nominees should also have knowledge of land use theories and growth management legislation, minimal potential for conflict of interest, a demonstrated interest in the welfare of Snohomish County, and should add balance to countywide representation on the commission.

Current Proposal

Motion 19-166 would appoint James Kamp to the Snohomish County Planning Commission to fill one of the Council District 5 positions that will become vacant when Commissioner Langston completes his term. The appointment is for a first full term, which would expire on July 1, 2023, after which Mr. Kamp would remain eligible to serve one additional complete term if reappointed.

Mr. Kamp has been nominated by Councilmember Low, and meets the requirements for service on the planning commission: Mr. Kamp is a resident of Snohomish County, is not an employee of Snohomish County, has sufficient time to attend all scheduled meetings, and would not be on more than two county boards or commissions if appointed.

Mr. Kamp has a background in local government as a city councilmember since January 2018; regional planning as a PSRC Transportation Policy Board member, Snohomish County Tomorrow Steering Committee member, and Snohomish County Law & Justice Council member and has volunteered for a number of community and charitable organizations.
