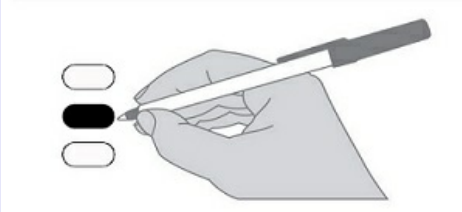

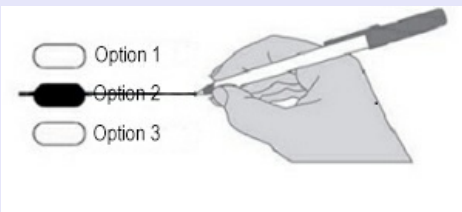
How to vote

Fire District 7 Proposition No. 1

Authorizing Regular Property Tax Levies

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire Protection District No. 7, Snohomish County, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 2019-10 concerning a proposition to restore the District's regular property tax levy. This measure would restore the District's regular property tax levy to \$1.50 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation for collection in 2020 and would authorize an annual increase in the limit factor of up to 3% (but not to exceed the \$1.50 rate) for each of the five succeeding years. The maximum allowable levy in 2024, collected in 2025, shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by Chapter 84.55 RCW.

Levy Lid Lift Property Tax Levy

The Board of Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 10 adopted Resolution No. 2019-01 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations.

This proposition would authorize the District to restore its regular property tax levy to \$1.37 per \$1,000 of assessed value to be assessed in 2019 and authorizes annual increases of up to 3% each of the five succeeding years to maintain fire protection, maintain the Queensborough Firehouse and to provide for firefighter safety. The maximum allowable levy in 2024 shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided in chapter 84.55 RCW.

Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services

The Board of Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 17 adopted Resolution No. 2019-03 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations.

This proposition would authorize the District to restore its regular property tax levy to \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value to be assessed in 2019 and collected in 2020. The funds will maintain and improve fire protection, emergency medical services and facilities, replace apparatus and equipment, and provide for firefighter safety. The maximum allowable levy in 2019 shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by chapter 84.55 RCW.

Fire District 26 Proposition No. 1

Levy of General Tax for Maintenance and Operations

The Board of Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 26 adopted Resolution No. 1-2019 concerning a proposition to adequately finance maintenance and operations. This proposition would authorize the District to levy excess property taxes upon taxable property within the District in the amount of \$300,000 per year for four consecutive years beginning in 2019 to be collected in the year following at an initial approximate levy rate of \$0.51 per thousand of assessed value (the actual levy rate will be based on assessed values at the time of the levies).
