**Probation has embraced the therapeutic approach to criminal justice. We do this through evidence-based practices in supervision as well as offering programs designed to reduce recidivism and promote pro-social behaviors.**

**Below is a brief explanation of the programs we currently provide.**

### **Alive at 25 and Attitudinal Dynamics of Driving**

Operated in partnership with the National Safety Council.

- Alive at 25 (AA25) is a four-hour interactive course for drivers 15-24 years of age that teaches personal responsibility and respectful decision making to ensure they make safe and legal driving decisions. This course must be approved by the Judicial Officer.
- Attitudinal Dynamics of Driving (ADD) is a six-hour interactive course for drivers 21 years and older. The course is designed for court referrals and drivers who exhibit risky and overly aggressive driving behaviors. This course requires Judicial approval.

### **Relicensing Accountability Program (RAP)**

- Designed for people whose driving privileges are currently suspended. The participant works with the court and develops a plan to successfully pay off fines and fees which enable them to obtain their driver's license and insurance. Participants are referred to the program through the following four outlets: Judicial, Probation, Embedded Social Worker or Community Resource Center

### **Domestic Violence-Moral Reconciliation Therapy**

Operated in partnership with Correctional Counseling Inc.

- Founded on the cognitive behavioral programming developed by CCI called Moral Reconciliation Therapy. The program is court ordered for people with a domestic violence charge. Participants appear weekly for a one and one-half hour group session where they present their weekly homework. This course is for a minimum of 24 weeks and allows people to begin the course at any time.

### **Mental Health Court**

- A diversion program for individuals with serious mental illness who have been charged with one or more criminal offenses. Participants must be 18 years of age or older and have a severe and persistent mental health condition as determined by a mental health professional. The participant must be legally competent and live within Snohomish County.

### **Electronic Home Detention**

- Jail alternative program for qualified low-risk, post-adjudicated individuals. The program uses transdermal alcohol monitoring and global positioning system tracking through ankle monitors. All court ordered participants need to have an initial appointment with the Electronic Monitoring Coordinator.
