Snohomish County to Host Virtual Public Meeting on Draft Changes to Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Plan

Written public comments welcome until August 13

EVERETT, Wash., July 21, 2021 – The Snohomish County Comprehensive Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Plan guides the Solid Waste division’s activities, including recycling, waste collection and disposal. County staff is currently updating the plan and will present changes to the public during a virtual meeting at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Aug. 4. Public comment will be taken on the draft changes during the meeting.

Snohomish County is currently in the midst of the 30-day written comment period, which will end on Friday, Aug. 13. The draft plan can be viewed at Sno-Isle Libraries throughout Snohomish County or on the website at www.snoco.org/solidwaste.

Periodic updates to county solid waste plans are required by Washington State law. The last update to this plan took place in 2013. The 2021 revision was prepared with the assistance of Snohomish County’s Solid Waste Advisory Committee, which included representatives of the cities and towns in Snohomish County, as well as residents and business representatives.

This plan is also being reviewed by the Washington Department of Ecology and other state agencies. Comments received from all sources will be considered in the production of the next draft, which will be prepared later this year and then offered for adoption by the participating cities, towns, and the Snohomish County Council.
