**Be sure you have a High School and Beyond Plan*

<p>Preparing for Adulthood Ages 16 to 21</p>	<p>Attend the Snohomish County Annual Transition Resource Fair</p> <p>In March and/or attend Front Door events hosted by School Districts throughout the school year</p>	<p>Apply for Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA)</p> <p>An essential partner for School to Work success. You can apply at any age and reapply as needed</p>	<p>Apply to Social Security Administration (SSA)</p> <p>Medicaid Is linked to SSI and is important for long term employment success. Apply at age 18</p>	<p>Explore Transportation Options</p> <p>Transportation Is vital for independence and employment success. Apply early!!!</p>

<p>S2W Eligibility Requirements Ages 20 to 21</p>	<p>Must Be Enrolled with: Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA)</p>	<p>Must Be Enrolled With: Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) Must have WA ID and SS card to work</p>	<p>Must Have: Social Security or Medicaid Eligibility To pay for long-term employment supports</p>	<p>Must Have Selected an Employment Provider: To obtain a job by June</p>
<p>S2W Expectations Final year of transition</p>	<p>Work with school and employment provider to reach employment goals</p>	<p>Meet with a Benefits Planner</p> <p>To help you understand how wages may impact your state and federal benefits Referral by DVR or County</p>	<p>Attend All Team Meetings and Ask Questions</p> <p>Give advanced notice and approval from employer before planning a vacation</p>	<p>Job Placements Can Occur Anytime Throughout the School Year</p> <p>The goal of School to Work is a paid job. You must stay enrolled in school throughout the school year as this is a coordinated effort</p>
