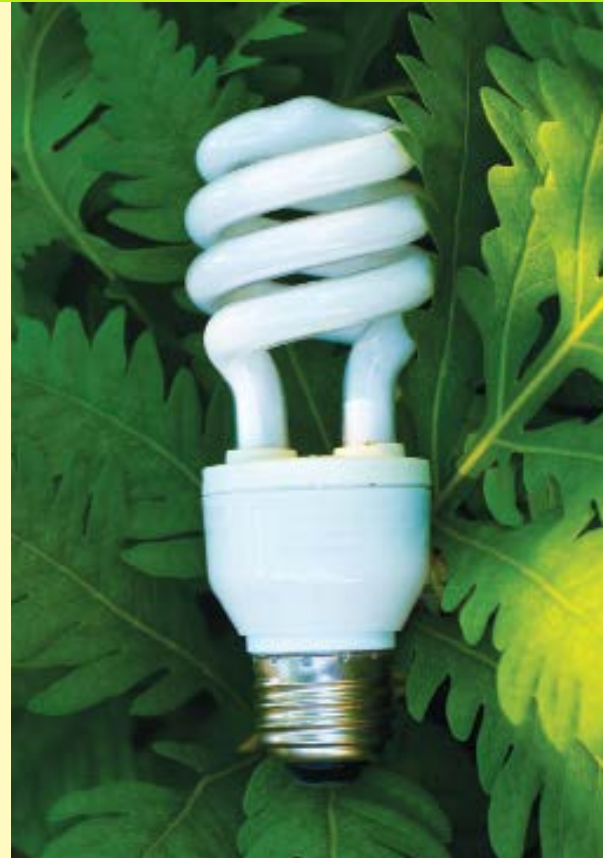

The Green Product Resource Guide

Snohomish County's Green Product Resource Guide (Resource Guide) is a resource developed to help staff comply with our new environmentally preferable purchasing and utilization policy (EPP), which took effect on February 18th, 2013. This Resource Guide is meant to be a tool to help employees make informed decisions when purchasing environmentally preferable products. It will be a useful tool in the assessment and acquisition of environmentally preferable products and services that meet your needs, the County's sustainability goals, and EPP requirements.

How do I use the Green Product Resource Guide?

The Green Product Resource Guide is split into three different sections: (1) Standards and Specifications, (2) Third Party Certifications, and (3) Additional Research Tools for Green Products and Building Materials.

1. Standards and Specifications

Organized by product type, this section provides information on the recommended minimum environmental standards or specifications to consider when purchasing a product or service. A wide variety of products are included in this Resource Guide, such as:

- Office supplies
- Computers and monitors
- Building materials and equipment
- Paint
- Vehicular projects
- Parks and recreation products
- And more...

The environmental standards and specifications for product types listed in this guide are from a variety of sources, namely the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Responsible Purchasing Network (RPN), and third party certifications.

The [Environmental Protection Agency's \(EPA\) Environmentally Preferable Purchasing \(EPP\) website](#) is a great resource for:

- Policy language for a particular product or service that can be used in bids, specifications, RFPs, RFQs, etc.
- Finding and evaluating green products and services
- Hands-on-tools for green purchasing

The [EPA's Comprehensive Procurement Guidelines](#) provide minimum recommended recycled content standards for product types in the following categories:

- Construction Products
- Landscaping Products
- Nonpaper Office Products
- Paper and Paper Products
- Park and Recreation Products
- Transportation Products
- Vehicular Products
- Miscellaneous Products

The Responsible Purchasing Network (RPN) is a useful tool to identify the minimum green standards that should be met when purchasing a specific product. The County is a member of RPN, which gives us access to a database of green products, model policies, model bids, model specifications to acquire green products and services, and a host of other green purchasing tools. In order to have full access to all of RPN's resources, County employees are encouraged to set-up their own login and password using the link provided with the County's RPN membership.

2. Third Party Certifications

There are products on the market that claim to be 'green' or 'natural' when in reality they are not, which is typically called 'greenwashing'. Greenwashing can make it difficult to know what products or services are a truly environmentally preferable. One of the best ways to verify whether a product is truly environmentally preferable is to look for the label of a third party certifier. Third party certifications are one of the most trusted forms of environmental conformance verification, because they require products to meet specific and rigorous environmental standards in order to receive certification. This section of the resource guide provides a list of some of the most trusted and recognized third party certification programs for green purchasing.

3. Additional Research Tools for Green Purchasing and Building Materials

This section provides a variety of research tools to assist in the evaluation of environmentally preferable building and construction materials. Several of the research tools listed in this guide are free, while others provide trial memberships before requiring a paid subscription. These tools are helpful to evaluate the toxicity of building materials or products, such as counter tops, carpet, wood framing, etc. Several of these tools also allow you to conduct a life cycle assessment on a particular product to evaluate its environmental, economic, and social impacts from inception, manufacturing and use, to product disposal. Employees are encouraged to test out these different research tools and provide feedback to the Purchasing Division or Office of Energy and Sustainability.
