

WELCOME!

Located just south of the cities of Monroe and Snohomish, Lord Hill Regional Park is a 1,400 acre park within a 4,000 acre ridge, that rises from the Snohomish River valley. This diverse park is laced with trails through wetlands, forests, and high points reaching over 600' off the valley floor.

The park supports a large population of birds, fish, and animals. Most evident are squirrels, shrews, mice, skunks, and deer. On occasion the bear, cougar, and bobcat, can be spotted.

HIKING



There are over six miles of marked, designated trails by which to explore the ponds (there are 9 of them), spot wildlife, and from the higher points, capture panoramic views of the distant Cascade and Olympic mountain ranges. Favorite view points are Devil's Butte Lookout and along the ridge of the Pipeline Trail.

BIKING

Mountain biking is a popular sport in the park. There are several options for single-track riding off of the main trails. Difficulty levels range from beginner to moderate. Know your limits, wear protective gear, and please adhere to all rules and signs.



EQUESTRIAN



Lord Hill is our premier equestrian park, offering many diverse trails for varying riding abilities. The equestrian parking lot accommodates up to 25 horse trailers and tow vehicles.

PARK RULES

Okay, every park has them, so let's get it over with. To maximize your enjoyment, take a few moments to review some important rules.

- Park hours are 7 AM—dusk
- No fires or overnight camping
- Alcoholic beverages, fireworks, and discharging of firearms are strictly prohibited
- Hunting is prohibited. Fishing requires applicable license(s)
- Remove and properly dispose of all trash
- Pets must be kept on an 8' leash, & under control at all times
- Remember to scoop! The shoe you save may be your own
- Lock your vehicle —stow valuables out of sight
- Stay on trails. Bikes yield to horses and hikers, hikers yield to horses
- For the enjoyment of all, loud speakers, stereo systems, and vuvuzelas are prohibited.

DRIVING DIRECTIONS

From I-5 take Exit 194 and head east on US-2 for 8.4 miles; exit US-2 at 88th St SE.; turn right at the top of the ramp onto 88th St. (Note: 88th St becomes 92nd St, then 2nd St.); turn left at Lincoln Ave S. which becomes the Old Snohomish-Monroe Hwy; turn right onto 127th Ave SE; drive south approx. 2-1/4 miles; turn left onto 150th St SE and proceed to the park entrance on the left.

The equestrian parking lot is approximately 20' past 150th on the left. Look for equestrian signs.
